An Afternoon At The Cut

Official summer holidays being over, the weather has turned glorious, and I have made the five-minute drive from Hightown to a spot on the side of one of the irrigation channels that run into the Alt. Someone, (whose mother must love them), has dumped some old

wood at the parking spot, but I have been here before, and know not to be put off.

Immediately, I spot a buzzard overhead. I grab my binoculars, but it is "mewing" so there is no doubt. My next "find", hiding among the grass at my feet, are my spectacles. At the first glimpse of the buzzard, I had hooked them behind my top shirt button, which would be a good idea if they ever stayed hooked!



I was hoping for damselflies, which were

fluttering around the water lilies the last time I was here. On that occasion, while I was watching them, I had been joined by a father and son who started pond-dipping. The son, (of about 8 years), impressively declared the

damselflies to be demoiselles, which they were indeed, and banded, I think. This time, a red-veined darter (pictured) poses conveniently for a picture.

A white van draws up, and any anti-white-van prejudice I might have had, evaporates when the driver gets out and says, "I love this place; I have been coming here for thirty years." He shows me the viewpoint from where he has seen chubb: on one occasion, about ten together. After a brief chat, he goes to cool his feet in the cut, and I walk on upstream.

In the cut there are juvenile coot (not to be confused with the "deaf old coot", which is what I get called, if I fail to respond to a marital instruction.) I am already content with the outing, when a flash of bright blue flies past, up the cut. "A KINGFISHER!" I shout. I have only seen about six in my life, and never this close to home. I saw one once, while on a canal in France. Having checked the translation, I proceeded to tell all the boats passing that "J'ai vu un matin-pêcheur!", to their bemusement and to the embarrassment of my wife and son. The joy that the sight of a kingfisher brings me, is out of all proportion with the four seconds it is actually in view.

A crane-fly (aka daddy-long-legs) lands in front of me. As I walk alongside the cut, blue dragonflies patrol their sections, never seemingly to stop flying. I am 90% sure they are common hawkers but there is no chance of a photo.

Wild flowers used to seem too varied and numerous for me to start identifying, but I have discovered a free phone app called "Seek", which, when you point the phone camera at plants, will identify them most of the time. It also works on amphibians, fungi, fish, reptiles, arachnids, birds, insects, molluscs & mammals. (Other such apps are available.)

I know that during the next winter I will be thinking of the summer to come. The image foremost in my mind will not be that of lying on a beach, or trips to stately homes, or travelling. Instead, the image will be of strolling in the countryside in the sunshine, encountering the flora and fauna, and rejoicing in their existence.

Our Eco Friendly Church

Eco Church is a scheme for churches in England and Wales, launched in 2016 and supported by A Rocha UK.

It encourages churches to think about how they are caring for God's earth in different areas of their life and work.



By filling in an online survey, a church will collect points towards a Bronze, Silver or Gold Church Award. To date, over 3000 churches have achieved awards. The survey covers 5 key areas of church life:

- Worship and teaching
- Management of church buildings
- Management of church land
- Community and global engagement
- Lifestyle

St Stephen's Church formed a small eco group, and achieved its Bronze Award in November 2019. This gave us a boost to undertake our community garden project in 2020 (National Lottery funded). After Covid and a period of interregnum-a period without our own vicar-we are now working towards our Silver Award.

The simple, yet impactful, Eco Tips from A Rocha, are intended to inspire us to make positive changes that will benefit our planet and future generations and draw us closer to God.

PUMPKIN OR BUTTERNUT SQUASH RISOTTO

This is a quick and easy dish for this time of year. It will remind you of sunny days in Italy and help you dream of holidays yet to come. The stock is traditionally added to risotto rice in ladlesful, one at a time. In this recipe, the stock is added all at once and the rice cooked for 15-20 minutes. It works well!

75g unsalted butter 1 tablespoon olive oil

6 shallots, peeled and finely chopped 250g pumpkin or butternut squash flesh cut small cubes

sea salt and ground black pepper 350 arborio risotto rice

1 litre vegetable stock 3-4 tablespoons dry white wine

50g grated Parmesan cheese

Melt the butter and oil in a medium saucepan, add the shallots and some pepper and fry for 5 minutes until softened. Add the pumpkin or butternut squash and fry for a further 2-3 minutes.

Add the rice and stir to coat in oil and butter. Add the stock in one go, cover and simmer until the rice is tender but firm. All the stock should be used up which should take 15-20 minutes.

When the rice is creamy, stir in the wine, salt and pepper and the Parmesan.

Cover and leave to rest for 1 minute before serving on hot plates with green salad and crusty bread.

St Oswald of Worcester: A Saint For The Leap Year

Whoever knew that there is a saint for the Leap Year? He is St Oswald of Worcester, who died on 29th February 992. His family story was extraordinary, and full of some surprising 'leaps', all by itself. It provides a tantalising glimpse of what happened to at least one of those pagan Viking warriors who settled in Anglo-Saxon Britain.

For Oswald's great-uncle had come to England c 865, as part of the 'Great Heathen Army' of Viking invaders. But his son, Oswald's uncle, Oda, forsook paganism, and not only converted to Christianity, but actually ended up as Archbishop of Canterbury. From there, Oda was in a position to help his nephew, Oswald, which he did.

Oda sent young Oswald to be educated at the abbey of Fleury, then a great centre of learning. There Oswald absorbed the Benedictine ideals which would guide his later life and work. Back in England, he became bishop of Worcester in 961, and with the support of King Edgar, eagerly

joined in major reforms of the Anglo-Saxon church. In 972 Oswald was made Archbishop of York, and seems to have taken a great interest in renewing the church in the Danelaw. He founded Ramsey Abbey, which became one of the great Fenland monasteries.

Oswald was popular as an archbishop, and always washed the feet of the poor every Lent. On 29th February 992 he had just completed this service at Worcester when he collapsed and died. In later years, Worcester adopted both him and Wulfstan to be its two chief saints: they flank the tomb of King John, which is before the high altar in Worcester Cathedral.
