

Editor's Note

As I sit here, on this gloriously sunny January day, I am reminded that we are already halfway through winter. What a happy thought!

It has been such a wet one that, on occasions, driving down Moss Lane out of Hightown, to-

wards Little Crosby, has seemed like travelling along a causeway between islands, for the Lancashire Plain, and The Moss, in particular, is both made up of, and defined by, water. In its pristine, original state, the area around Hightown must have looked pretty much like the

recently flooded fields and have been a precious haven for those creatures that depended on water, such as wading birds and wildfowl, which, we are still lucky enough to see down on the beach. In fact, over the last few days, I have seen five white egrets wading in the flooded field at the side of White Edge Farm (on the left as you leave Hightown.)

Nicholas Blundell, in his diary written between 1702 and 1728, describes the small number of dwellings, in the area that we would now call Hightown, as 'the houses on the moor' and notes the difficulty in accessing the cottages. The sight of the flooded fields in the last few weeks makes one think how easily, without human intervention, nature could reclaim its own.

I love the changing seasons and all the excitement that they provide, but by the time you read this there'll only be one more winter month to go. I, for one, am looking forward to some warmer, drier weather. There's no harm in being optimistic!



























BROCCOLI, CHIVE and PARMESAN FRITTATA

This is a lovely, easy antidote to all the calorie heavy, rich goodies we have been subjected to over the last few weeks. I have slaved over a hot stove for ever it seems so this is a good dish to try or, even better, get someone else to give it a try and you a well-earned rest. Serve it with a healthy leafy salad and some boiled miniature potatoes.

Ingredients

300g purple sprouting broccoli 8 large eggs

50ml semi-skinned milk 2 tblsp chopped fresh chives

100g Parmesan cheese, grated Salt & black pepper

2 tblsp olive oil1 garlic clove,

fresh Parmesan shavings

Method

Trim and wash the broccoli, then chop into small pieces about 1cm in length.

Crack the eggs into a bowl. Add the milk, chives, Parmesan, salt and pepper. Beat together with a hand whisk until amalgamated and set aside.

Heat the oil in a large non-stick frying pan. Add the garlic and broccoli and fry over a low heat, stirring frequently until tender. Season lightly. Preheat the grill.

Pour the egg mixture over the broccoli, covering the whole of the bottom of the pan. Cook over a medium heat for 3-4 minutes stirring gently until the egg begins to set.

Transfer the pan to the grill and cook for a further 2-3 minutes until the top is set and golden.

Portion up with a sharp knife, top each slice with parmesan shavings and serve with a salad and potatoes.

A Good Read by Colette Hudson

Continuing our exploration of Hightown, in past times, courtesy of Miss Chris Scott's book

Well, whoever knew that Hightown had once been a centre of aviation in 1910? And so much more exciting than playing on a screen!

Miss Scott had received the following, very interesting information on this subject from Mr. E. Pownall. In 1910 he lived with his family at 'Harefield', Alt Rd and subsequently retired to the Isle of Man.

Miss Scott quotes from his letter:

'Some three of four years before the outbreak of the 1914/18 War, Hightown became a centre, (or at least the geometric centre), of early aviation. H. G. Melly was operating at Waterloo Sands and Compton Paterson, R.C. Feniwick and others at Freshfield with Hightown between them. Early in my 'teens' I became very keen on flying and made many models, for which the sandhills were fine testing ground. Some were just gliders but many were driven by twisted elastic and carved wooden propellors. In 1912, a school friend decided to make a glider which could carry either of us. It was a bi-plane of about 20 ft span. The framework was of slender bamboo poles. Free gliding was not a success, so we decided to do towed flights on the sandhills with long ropes, one to each wing tip and two or three lusty helpers pulling on each. One day we met with disaster—the plane was on the ground near 'Westwood' in Windermere Rd when a sudden and heavy gust of wind picked it up and wrapped it round a lamp-post. An ignoble and!

During the 1914/18 War I joined the Royal Flying Corps as a pilot, becoming a Flight Commander. After the war, I joined the Aeronautical Inspection Dept in the Air Ministry and served with the Dept until I became Head of the Aircraft Inspection Division, retiring in 1956....... I sometimes shudder at my amateur efforts and risks taken in my very early experiments at Hightown.'



Toddler Time
