Editor's Note

I attended a convent school from the age of five years old to eighteen and Lent was a major

landmark in the year. During this period of time we would raise money for the Christian missionaries, of whom, I had a cloudy idea

wore long woollen robes, and worked in Africa, helping children and getting very hot.

At the start of Lent the teacher would put a chart of ladders on the classroom wall, one ladder per pupil, and give every pupil a paper baby, (dutifully crayoned in to the highest standard.) Every day, during Lent, we would take a penny, (1D), or two into school. In return, we could move our paper baby, one rung per penny, up the ladder labelled with our name. When the baby got to the top, you then received another paper baby and the exercise was repeated.

It was very competitive! I would beg, steal or borrow, (well maybe not steal!) to get pennies to take in. I would raid my carefully guarded money box to ensure that I had the most babies at the top of my ladder. I was certain, as were we all, that whoever won the competition would receive a real live baby, from a missionary, to take home and keep.

What a cruel disappointment lay ahead! We reached the end of term and all we got was more paper, this time in the form of a paper basket containing tissue paper and chocolate eggs. Not even a Tiny Tears baby doll!

Dear Friends,

March this year sees the start of Lent with Ash Wednesday being the 5th, and so our Lenten journey begins, a time of prayer, reflection, study and for some fasting. What does Lent mean to you?



When I was younger, a question often asked was, 'What are you giving up for Lent'? I have given up many things over the years, chocolate, biscuits, cake, crisps, supper! My late wife gave up playing 'Spider Solitaire' on the computer one year and she found that the hardest thing ever to give up! I recall she made up for it though, with several hours of playing on Easter Day evening, whilst I was left to bath and settle the children to sleep!

Lent is a period of forty days, well, forty six, including the Sundays, although traditionally Sundays don't 'count'. Forty days is a significant period of time in both the Old and New Testament. In Genesis, the flood that destroyed the earth was brought on by forty days and nights of rain. In Hebrews, the Israelites spent forty years in the wilderness before reaching the promised land. In Exodus, Moses fasted for forty days before receiving the Ten Commandments at Mount Sinai. The Synoptic Gospels tell us Jesus spent forty days in the wilderness fasting in preparation for his ministry. Jesus remained on earth forty days after the resurrection.

Giving something up for Lent can be a way of symbolically uniting yourself to the mystery of Jesus' own temptation in the desert. It is also a time to ponder your own priorities in your life, and to realign your will with God's, set things right.

However, taking something up for Lent can be good too! Set aside some time each day to spend in prayer, or even just in silence. The Church of England this year has produced a book of forty daily reflections, 'Living Hope: A Lent Journey'.

You could declutter your home. Donate forty things you haven't used or you don't need, to a charity shop. You could put a 'pound in a pot' each day as a thanksgiving gift and then donate it to charity. Do something nice for someone each day. There are many things you could do.

Whatever we do, let's prepare our minds and our hearts for Easter and make secure, fix firmly, the place of Jesus in our lives, and be further shaped in His image, as we walk together the Lenten journey.

Some while back, St Stephen's Church joined the A Rocha Eco Church Community to gain inspiration and ideas to help us, and our church, progress in our aims to care for God's world in all areas. God in the Sciences

Science and a sense of the Transcendent

What is the difference between a cathedral and a physics lab? Are they not both saying: 'Hello'? - Annie Dillard

Scientists often speak of a reality beyond the objects they are studying, and for some this is encountered in powerful – if rare – episodes of wonder and awe. The Christian writer J.W. Sire quotes this line from Annie Dillard in his book 'Echoes of a Voice', which explores spiritual or 'transcendent' experiences.

In his analysis of these experiences, Sire describes moments that are "emotional, intellectual, highly charged, usually sudden, unannounced, often odd, some weird, others glorious", and places them on three different levels:

A material object that points beyond the material reality. For example, someone might develop a sense of what is good and evil, based on the actions of others.

Experience of "something personal...just behind the surface of what we are directly experiencing, often something with which one feels at peace or even at one, or, perhaps, as dangerous or threatening."

A felt presence that has a specific character or presence, e.g., holiness, or inspiring humility, fearful awe or wonder.

According to Sire, level 1-2 experiences are fairly common but level 3 is rare. He gives a wide range of examples, including scientists. Some of these people are religious or interested in spirituality, others are atheists. Some of their moments of transcendence carried a particular meaning, others simply sparked curiosity.

The famous geneticist Francis Collins described several significant moments when he was young: "being transported by the experience of looking through a telescope", or "a Christmas Eve where the descant on a particularly beautiful Christmas carol...left me with a sense of unexpected awe and a longing for something I could not name".

These experiences meant that when Collins was faced with the question of belief in God, "all [his] arguments seemed very thin". Now, as a fully-fledged scientist and a believer in God, he is able to say that "for a scientist who occasionally is given the remarkable privilege of discovering something not previously known by man, there is a special kind of joy associated with such flashes of insight."

Most of us are not scientists, but we may well have had experiences like this in different contexts. How can we, in our engagement with scientifically minded individuals, make connections through our shared experience of the transcendent? Can we listen as well as explain, finding some common points of connection?

PUY LENTILS WITH ROSEMARY

This is a versatile dish which when cooked can be used in an interesting number of delicious ways to stuff vegetables such as peppers, to form the base of a vegetarian shepherd's pie or as an accompaniment to baked jacket potatoes. The quantities given



would serve up to six people so I pop individual portions into freezer pots and keep some frozen for later use when one has no idea what to have for supper and no time to start from scratch.

Ingredients

3 tbsp extra virgin olive oil1 medium onion, finely chopped2 garlic cloves, finely chopped3 tbsp rosemary, finely chopped340g puy lentils, well rinsed850ml vegetable stockSalt and pepper½ tbsp red wine vinegar

Method

Heat 1 tbsp of olive oil in a medium-sized saucepan and add onion and garlic. Cook over a low heat until softened, translucent but not coloured.

Add the rosemary and lentils. Cook for a further minute and then add stock.

Bring to the boil, cover and simmer gently for about an hour when most of the liquid should have been absorbed.

Before serving, season with salt and pepper to taste and add the remaining oil and the vinegar.

Serving suggestions:

Stuff lengthwise halved and deseeded Romano peppers, top with squares of mozzarella cheese and sliced cherry tomatoes and bake in the oven until bubbling and golden.

Use as a base for a shepherd's pie topped with mashed, cooked sweet potato covered with grated cheese and again cooked through in the oven.

Pony Traps

'These were the most popular forms of transport in the early days in Hightown. Mr J Savin reminded me of some of the people who were seen passing up and down to the station or going for rides in the neighbourhood. A Mr and Mrs Palmer, Blundell Road, had a yellow pony trap, with two ponies. Mr R Ratcliffe,



of 'Westwood', Mrs Rimmer of Sandy Lane and Miss McGuinness' father and mother also used this form of transport.' For a number of years, the milk was delivered by pony and trap by Mrs Jones of Rose Cottage, who delivered it fresh from Frith's Farm Dairy (later Berry's) out of the milk urns, on the back of the trap.

Miss Berry told Miss Scott that they kept a special cow for infants and invalids.

Some of you will remember Gill Rowe and Barbara Hope, who regularly drove their traps around Hightown, Barabara's pulled by Jake (pictured above) and Gill's by Prince. At Christmas, they would decorate their carriages festively and carry Father Christmas, and his fairy, (for a number of years, my younger self), around Hightown and to the children's party. In the photograph, they can be seen dressed up as Victorian ladies whilst visiting St Mary's Primary School, Little Crosby for a Victorian themed day. Their groom, holding Jake, may also look familiar! Both Barbara and Gill were highly skilled and competent carriage drivers, entering competitions with great success over a number of years.


Astronomy in Hightown

'From the years 1930 to the time he passed away, Mr George Whittle, a well known member of the Liverpool Astronomical Society was a familiar figure in Hightown. He could often be seen on the sandhills attached to his home, gazing through his telescope at distant objects and watching the phases of the moon which he had many times photographed with his own camera.


He was, in fact, a scientific instrument maker and during the years when the late Sir Oliver Lodge experimented in wireless telegraphy at the then Liverpool University College, Mr Whittle made the instruments in connection with all the experiments. He was with Oliver Lodge and the then young Marconi, when he (Sir Oliver) got sound through a stone wall for the first time in history and that was a proud, never to be forgotten, moment for Mr Whittle.'

Lighting 1911

'Everyone had lamps and candles. Later, petrol gas was made on the site opposite Our Lady of Victories. It smelled and fizzed! Eventually, there was a fire there and it was destroyed. Then the site was used for making bricks for houses from sand. THEN CAME ELECTRICITY - GREAT EXCITEMENT! This power was borrowed from the power house (Railway) at Formby (now a factory.) This was WONDERFUL! As the trains pulled out from the station, the lights went dim—if two trains went out together, the lights went out altogether! I believe it was then 1/6d a unit. It was only used for lighting, of course. If the weather was stormy, (which knowing Hightown, it was frequently), the overhead wires blew down. One was never safe unless a supply of candles or old oil lamps were kept in readiness. The light failed frequently on a Sunday evening during church services. Candles kept in the vestry for the Sunday School children to light, when celebrating their birthdays, were often borrowed to light the pulpit. A nod from the preacher, and out came the matches and candles!!!'
















