Wilbur, a timid Labrador, took fright whilst out on a lead walk in the dunes. He tugged free from his extending lead, leaving his owner holding only the hard plastic handle, and went missing. The news about Wilbur travelled quickly, both by word of mouth and online and very soon there were many people out looking and calling for Wilbur: family, friends, the Hightown dog community and general community alike. I saw adults, on foot, shining torches and children with sharp eyes on the lookout for him. I saw one of Wilbur's canine friends, out with his owners, searching for him. There were people driving round the roads looking. By 1am everyone was tired and, with heavy hearts, his owners went home to try to rest. They left their door open all night, in the hope that Wilbur would find his way home, but to no avail. Never giving up hope, at 5am they resumed their search. This time they were in luck! They found Wilbur down by the toad ponds with his lead all tangled up in the bushes and unable to get free.

His family said that right throughout the evening and the next morning, they had felt loved and supported by their whole community.

Once again in our village I witnessed, at first hand, Jesus' command to "love your neighbour as yourself." It made me very proud to be a member of our caring community. Sometimes God's words leap right off the page of the Bible and we see Him in action in front of our very own eyes. This was one such occasion.



Christian Aid

Jen, a loving mum in Malawi, dreams of her children being able to have the education they deserve.

Her hard-working boys have earned places at top colleges – but Jen cannot afford to send them both. 'My heart longs to see our children finish school,' says



Jen. 'These dreams are very important to me, because by doing so, I'll be sure that I am creating a good future for the children.'

A terrible dilemma

Her oldest two boys have gained tertiary education places, which is very rare for young people from her rural area. One has a place at a prestigious polytechnic and one at a well-known college – it's even on one of Malawi's banknotes.

Jen works hard to provide for her children. But she can barely scratch a living from the soil. Soaring costs of food, fuel, fertiliser, school uniforms and school fees are crushing dreams and keeping her family in poverty.

Now, Jen has had to make a choice. One that no mum should be forced to make. Rising costs mean Jen can pay for only one of her sons' college courses.

Help this strong and determined mum provide for her family's future.

Jen desperately needs to earn more, so that her oldest son Mathews can study as well. His place at a prestigious college is reserved for a year, so Jen remains hopeful that he'll be able to start his course. The erratic weather is affecting Jen's profits. 'The result is that our harvest is very little,' she says. But Jen remains resilient. 'We say, let's work hard so that the money will help the children go to school,' she smiles.

SHANTIES AND HARPS by Kevin Howard

For me it all started a dozen years ago, when the Liverpool Shanty Kings performed on stage in St Stephen's church hall. I was in the audience, then, and was invited to join the group a few weeks later. The group was established in 2007 in preparation for Liverpool's Capital of Culture year, to promote maritime music in Liverpool. Since then, it has played hundreds of venues at local festivals, pubs, sports clubs, care homes, churches and church halls. We enjoy performing at private events such as birthday parties, retirement celebrations and wedding receptions. We have sung on board Cruise Liners and have again been booked for Mersey Ferry excursions this summer. We sang at the Albert Dock at the 125th Anniversary of Cunard when the 'Three Queens' were re-united in Liverpool and on the Daniel Adamson Tug, filmed by Granada for the National news.

Shanties are sailors' brisk work songs from the old wooden sailing ship days. The Shantyman sings a line or a verse and the crew then join in with the chorus, picking up the rhythm of, say, loading cargo, heaving up the anchor, hauling on the ropes (sheets) to unfurl the sails or pumping out the bilges (which they did continuously in the old sailing ships). Often, the accompaniment was just a drum beat to keep time (we use tambourines now) or simple musical instruments, one of which was a mouth organ (harmonica also referred to as a 'harp'). We also sing more poignant shanties known as 'forebitters', sung by sailors when they were off duty, yearning for home and loved ones on their month's-long voyages.

During a performance, for a each song, one member (the Shantyman) sings the lead verses then all ('the crew'!) participate in the chorus, with the audience invited to join in. There are eleven in the band, including guitar, banjo, accordion and harmonica.

All the accompanists take their turns singing whist playing – regrettably, as a harpist, not something I have mastered! We practice sporadically when we have a performance coming up or to learn a new song – we already have a repertoire of about 60 songs (not all shanties, lots of Liverpool, some Irish and folk). Thanks to The Hightown Pub for allowing us to practice in their back room. And the railway station is handy for the group members who live further away. We have been booked to play at The Hightown as part of a daylong celebration of music on Saturday May 13th, the Saturday after the King's Coronation.

I can never remember a time when I could not play the harmonica – when I was eleven my favourite harp was confiscated for a term by a teacher for playing the melody of an impolite ditty during break. I also had difficulty practising when we had dogs, as they would whine loudly at the sound, no matter how sweetly I played. The main way to ruin a harmonica is to blow it after eating as even the



slightest crumb can seize up the delicate reeds – so when the Shanty Kings have a mid-concert break and tuck into their sandwiches I have to starve! I look after my several three-octave, double-reeded harmonicas extra carefully as each one costs about £45 and I need several in different keys. These are ideal for the St Stephen's church band. I use more robust slightly cheaper but good quality harps for the Shanty Kings.

I love playing harmonica in the church band on the first Sunday of the month — playing the hymns is a different challenge. Whereas with the Shanty Kings, once I know the tune, I just improvise an accompaniment; but in the church band I need to play from the musical notation with other musicians. This discipline also helps my sight-reading for Formby Choral Society to which I have also belonged for many years. Of course, as already mentioned, this means, I can't sing on band-Sundays. But there are lots of other Sundays when I can and do praise God, by singing lustily in the congregation from the 'body of the kirk'.







Ingredients

The outward and visible act of anointing signifies an inward grace: we pray that God would bless and set apart King Charles to serve the people of our nation and Commonwealth with humility and joy.

Sue Taylor meets Chris Scrine.

Chris was born and educated in Leicester and graduated in hotel management. Following on, Chris worked for Novotel and privately owned hotels. After gaining a post graduate degree in Human Resource Management at Doncaster, Chris travelled to Switzerland to work there for one year.

During his time in Leicester, Chris worked as an assistant personnel manager at Marconi.



On moving to Liverpool in 1994, he lived in the city centre before moving to Hightown. Chris then gained a post as Personnel Manager/General Manager of an occupational training college. He left that post in 2013 to build up a performance coaching business. A great deal of his work involved going into schools to work with students in life skills, interview key skills and counselling.

Chris has lived in Hightown since 1998 and enjoys living here very much. He has one son, Daniel, and is a member of the Blundellsands Sailing Club. He undertakes consultancy work at The Prohibition Recording Studios in Liverpool, where his work involves organising live performances, parties and working with recording artists.

In 2014 Chris was appointed to the role of Chairman at the Hightown Club in Thirlmere Road, a well established sports and social club, which was founded in 1907. The work revolves around liaising with the various sports teams – cricket ,squash, bowls, tennis, veterans football, Crosby St. Mary's RUFC and The Social Club. Various social events are held throughout the year and more events are being planned to be held on a regular basis.

This leads Chris into telling me about his role as community liaison officer for Hightown Connections. He was appointed in November 2022 and the role is funded by the Lottery. In this role he has established a monthly luncheon club, again funded by the Lottery, comprising a two course meal for £7.50. He has also established a monthly film club, open to Hightown residents of all ages, sponsored by The Living Well Fund. No charges are made and refreshments are available.

There are plenty of activities on offer at the Hightown Club (see the website) and there are going to be celebrations organised for the Coronation and for the Eurovision Song Contest.

So thank you Chris, and your supporting staff, for making the Hightown Club such a great place to socialise.


