CARRY ON CAMPING

I have been going on camping holidays for all my married life — and even before that with the Guides. I met my husband, Chris, who was a keen Scout and Scouter and went with him to the Lakes and the Brecon Beacons and slept in a tent. We canoed, cooked over open fires and enjoyed camp fire sing songs. Ask Colin Goodyear what it was like with 40 Hightown teenagers on the Llyn Peninsular in a field filled with an odd assortment of tents, one cold tap and one toilet. The experiences have given many people a fund of memories. Our editor, Colette, will well remember the Duke of Edinburgh camps in the Lakes.

When our son, Douglas, arrived, he had his first camping trip to Wasdale at the tender age of 3 months. He slept in a carry cot on wheels in a frame tent and could be wheeled away when he cried in the night. Since then, most years, we have been away with a tent. Chris and Douglas often went backpacking in the Lakes, the Peak District and once braved crossing the Channel, carrying all they needed in a rucksack apiece.



To be out in the fresh air is a delight as long as it does not rain too much and the nights do not get too cold. My sister-in-law and her family are ardent campers and we have spent many family gatherings on a site with 4 or 5 tents, a group of adults and cousins enjoying the freedom of the camping life. The whole Cresswell clan met up for a 70th

birthday – the place immaterial, the gathering the most important.

My sister-in-law and her husband have a trailer tent which is easy to erect. We have gone from an ancient canvas one, via various poled and frame models to our present one which may be thought too big but it suits us. It does not have poles but tubes which are inflated using a pump powered by the car battery. In about 20 minutes our palace has risen from the grass and we can begin installing the bits and pieces that make it a home from home. 2 camp beds,

mattresses, sheets and duvets furnish the bedroom. The kitchen is set up, as is the dining table and chairs. Last but certainly not least the electrics are plugged in. Now we have light, a cooker, a fridge and, best of all, a kettle. How we look forward to that cup of tea when all is finished.

It may be astonishing to many of you that we still enjoy this holiday once a year but it is worth the effort. There is an upside to this. I get to stay in good hotels en-route ,there and back, and we do have other sorts of holidays. We even

contemplated a cruise to the north of Scotland but COVID scuppered that.


