Dear Friends,

On Sunday 12th November, as a village we will gather around the war memorial to remember and give thanks for those who have lost their lives in conflicts going back over a century, and at 11am we will fall silent for two minutes. Some folks may look at the names carved on the memorial; indeed some may have a personal connection. Others may



pray in silence during this time, but all of us assembled there will remember. "We will remember them".

At St Stephen's we continue to hear the Ukrainian national anthem before our service on the first Sunday of each month as we remember the people of Ukraine, at home and displaced. Sadly, we are now witnessing fresh conflict in Israel and Gaza; thousands of people fleeing their homes with reception areas unable to cope. We must continue to pray for peace.

It's important to remember the sacrifices of so many who died striving for peace in our world.

In the Holy Gospel of +John, Jesus said to his disciples, "Peace I leave with; my peace I give you", before he left them and he sent the Holy Spirit, a promised gift to them. The Prince of Peace will forever be with them because of what he manifests in his community of discipleship.... Love, Joy and Peace.

Henri Nouwen, a great and gifted writer walked the road to peace and over time developed a wonderful, beautiful spirituality of non-violence. Henri wants us to spend time in prayer, praying for peace, the end of conflicts.

He wrote, "For Jesus, there are no countries to be conquered, no ideologies to be imposed, no people to be dominated. There are only children, women and men to be loved."

"As peacemakers we must resist all the powers of war and destruction and proclaim that peace is the divine gift offered to all who affirm life."

Wherever you are on Sunday 12th at 11am, do pause, do fall silent, do remember with gratitude those who have given their lives, and if you can, offer a prayer for peace in our world. Prayers are always heard.

If you can be with us at the memorial, you will be most welcome to join us in church afterwards for our Remembrance Day Service.

Remembrance 1950-1953

Korea: The Forgotten War

"A distant obligation honourably discharged"

These modest words were written by John Bowler MC, a National Service veteran of the Korean War, for inscription on the Korean War Memorial, unveiled in London's Victoria Embankment Gardens on 3 December, 2014.

The Korean War ended inconclusively 70 years ago with an armistice signed on 27 July 1953. There was no outright victory and no peace treaty. It was a brutal war that cost the lives of 1,263 British and Commonwealth soldiers, including 18- and 19-year-old National Servicemen. Injured soldiers totalled 4,817and 1,060 were taken prisoner. The injured included soldiers who had been cruelly beaten, subjected to long starvation, and psychologically damaged by brainwashing techniques whilst in Chinese captivity.

On 5 June 1950 North Korea, supported by Soviet Russia and Communist China, invaded South Korea crossing the 38th Parallel that divided Communist North Korea from democratic South Korea, capturing South Korea's capital Seoul. The same day the United States obtained United Nations (UN) resolution condemning the invasion and two days later a further resolution calling on member states to assist South Korea in repelling the invaders. Russia boycotted the meeting and did not impose a veto. An American-led UN force was quickly assembled for action in Korea.

The United States now turned to Britain for military support in Korea. Even though suffering from Post War austerity, worsened by food shortages and strict rationing, Britain agreed to contribute resources to the UN force, putting



the British Far East fleet at the disposal of the Americans and ordering two Army infantry brigades to Korea. They were later joined by other forces, units and services. In all, more than 82,000 British service personnel were deployed in Korea. This decision was taken, partly to show solidarity with America's fight against the spread of communism and partly to restrain American use of the atom bomb against North Korea.

Early arrivals in Korea included a detachment of Royal

Marines. Commando 41 teams were dropped by US submarine on the coast of North Korea where they carried out successful hit-and-run raids. Among their number was Geoffrey Morrissey, who today lives in Hightown and his wife, Pamela. We salute him and all who served in Korea.

The war against North Korea was primarily led by the Americans who, in a series of engagements, successfully pushed the North Koreans back across the 38th parallel. Fearful that the Americans intended to expand the War into China, the Chinese mobilised an army of 300,000 troops to launch a fresh invasion of South Korea. On Christmas Day 1950 a vanguard of 60,000 Chinese troops crossed the 38th Parallel. Following the historic route to Seoul, they reached the Imjin river thirty miles north of Seoul on 23 April 1951. Here they found the river crossings held by the British 29th Infantry Brigade. Then followed the fiercest battle fought by British troops since World War II. Both sides sustained heavy casualties. After three days of desperate fighting against overwhelming odds the 29th Brigade was ordered to withdraw to a new position north of Seoul

Tragically, the 1st Battalion The Gloucestershire Regiment who had been ordered to cover the Brigade's withdrawal, found themselves trapped under heavy Chinese fire. Running out of ammunition, and with no hope of relief, they were forced to surrender and were taken into harsh Chinese captivity for the remainder of the war. The British stand at the Battle of the Imjin River captured the world's imagination and ranks high in the annals of the British Army. Their brave stand had enabled the UN forces to regroup, preventing the Chinese reaching Seoul. Unable to sustain their invasion, the Chinese fell back across the 38th Parallel.

The Korean War saved democratic South Korea from Communist occupation, opening the way for its present economic prosperity, but failed to halt the threat from North Korea. As recently as last August, Kim Jong-un, the authoritarian leader of North Korea ordered his oppressed people to make ready for war "to sweep away the South Korean puppets". The world watches and waits for the next chapter in the troubled story of Korea.
