

An Obituary for our Churchwarden Michael Cudby 30/12/1943 - 25/12/2022 By Geoff Bailey

Michael was born in Upney near Barking, South London then moved to York when he was 11 years old. On leaving school, he joined the Merchant Navy and his claim to fame, on a night watch, was turning the ship around 360 degrees just for a laugh! After leaving the Merchant Navy he studied to become a Quantity Surveyor and later



on achieved the distinction of a becoming a Fellow of the Royal Institution of Quantity Surveyors. After having obtained his degree, he went to Bahrain for six years, working for various development and construction companies. He then moved to Dubai, working for Balfour Beatty and other similar companies. In the mid 1990's, Michael moved back to London, where he completed a post graduate course from Reading University, for which he was awarded the prestigious Harold Samuel Award for his dissertation on 'The Restoration of Old Buildings'. He then moved back to Hightown in early 2003, met Jayne, and they got married in 2007. In 2009 Jayne and Michael moved to Spain, enjoying a well earned retirement, but coming back to Hightown on a regular basis for visiting relations.

I met Michael and Jayne when they came to church, shortly after they arrived back in Hightown. I found him to be a very well travelled and interesting gentleman. When he became a churchwarden in 2020, he wholeheartedly embraced the role. Subsequently, when I became a churchwarden in 2021, he helped me to understand the values and importance of the position. His knowledge of building regulations and various building techniques was invaluable. As a committed Christian, he was always seeking answers to questions about our faith and its contribution to society. I will miss his companionship and friendship. May he rest in peace and rise in glory.





What prompted you to start the group and when?

I started the group in 2015 after regularly fishing at Hightown and noticing the deteriorating condition of our local coastal beaches with debris such as plastics, litter and other washed-up larger items. Hightown beach is a special place for my wife and I, as we did our courting here, many years ago. Also, it has a definite beginning and end, so making the project a little more manageable. Although there had been the odd clean before, they were only scraping the surface of what turned out to be a big problem. As we organised more

monthly beach cleans, the real problem was uncovered. There were years, many years, of debris under old tidelines, buried beneath the dunes. We have litter from the late 60s and 70s that we have collected, and continue to collect, after recent storms.

Many volunteers from our Hightown cleaning events have gone on to organising cleans on their own beaches, such as Crosby and





My plan was to have a monthly beach clean in Hightown. To date we have had 106 and my



plans are to continue doing so. We also have official surveys to monitor the debris. From January 2022 my target was to prioritize cleaning up the old historic tidelines. We held nine events during which we used a riddle to sieve the microplastics and debris and we removed the



scrap metal from the left-hand side of the sailing club. We had a big clean-up from the mouth of the Alt, by the Alt Centre, where we removed and cleared more than a skipful of larger debris as well as sieving microplastics. In addition, we have held a number of glass picks and to date have removed over sixty five rubble sacks of glass from our beach, making it much safer place to use and to walk dogs. We have also spread our group actions onto Altcar Training Camp beach, where we do two clean-ups in the winter time. With the kind

permission of and help from the Camp Commandant, Gordon Black, and his staff, this area is now looking much better.







What are your plans for the future?

With big thanks to our volunteers and solo pickers, who now regularly clean up our beach in Hightown, we aim to spread our net wider. This year, I plan to only organise events after the bigger tides, giving us more time to get involved with other local environmental projects such as our dune maintenance. Working alongside Green Sefton throughout the winter

months, we aim to improve our dunes to help local wildlife. We will continue to target the historic debris as it is uncovered by tidal erosion of the dune edge.

From Harry's Kitchen

HAM & PEA SOUP IN A SLOW COOKER

This can be cooked on the hob, but one has to be watchful to prevent sticking or burning on the hottom of the pan/not including non stick

the bottom of the pan/pot, including non stick. Time approximately 3 hours.



Ingredients

- 1 x ham shank
- 1 x 500gram pack dried marrowfat peas
- 2 x medium size onions
- 2 large carrots
- 2-3 medium size potatoes
- 2-3 celery stalks
- 2-3 chicken stock cubes in 3 pints (1.5 litres) of water

Method

Soak dried peas overnight. Drain off water and rinse.

Place ham shank and peas into cooker with the chicken stock; cook on high heat for 4 hours;

Chop up the rest of the vegetables and add to the cooker after 4 hours. Turn down to low heat and cook for another 4 hours.

After cooking leave to cool down. Remove the ham shank from the pot; remove the skin and fat. Chop up the meat. Divide the meat into 2 portions. Return 1 portion back into soup.

The soup is ready for the processer. Put 4 fl oz. (120ml) water in the processer add the soup.

It will take about 4 fills to process all the soup. Return the balance of the chopped ham to the soup. The soup should be thick, just add water if you require a thinner soup.

Serve with crusty bread and enjoy this filling meal.
