

Sea Bees

This coming spring, I will have been an apiarist for twelve entire months! In that time, I have twice harvested honey from hives and even named them according to their unique family personality. I have learned so much in this time; without a doubt, I have so much more knowledge and many



more skills to acquire. One thing hasn't changed though, I really do love my bees.



My family hives are named: Athena, Circe, Iris, Pandora and Eris. Each hive has a queen, and each queen is the matriarch of a large family, one that will grow to its full potential, circa 60,000 worker bees, by mid-summer. Athena was my first hive; she is named after the goddess of wisdom and victory. The Circe hive is named after the goddess of Sorcery and Magic; the Pandora hive is named after the goddess who is all-gifted. The Iris hive is named after the goddess of sea and sky. Finally, the hive named Eris, my most

challenging family hive, is named after the goddess of discord: in total, I have been stung seven times, and only by the ladies in this hive!

It is a fact that bees are defensive and *do not attack*; despite this, it is important to dress appropriately, not only to guard yourself but to save a bee from dying. Most readers may not know that male drone bees cannot sting, and that following the queen's single maiden flight, they are essentially of no use to a hive. Female worker bees have numerous roles; they either collect propolis and seal gaps in the hive or collect nectar and pollen. Many bees are attached to the nursery, either feeding pupa or sealing cells with wax: all are loyal to the queen. Drones are first to be booted out of the hive come winter; the worker bees can create more drones by simply choosing the gender of each pupa according to when they

stop feeding it, in order for them to hatch. A drone is created in 24 days, a worker bee in 21 and a queen in 16. Interestingly, all eggs are potential queens. However, worker bees only create queens when the hive overcrowds, and bees consider swarming or when the queen is showing signs of slowing down, usually in her fifth year. At the height of the summer season, each queen can lay up to 2000 eggs a day!

Certainly, the honey sold from The Crib, usually via our honesty





stall is organic. We do not spray our bees, nor treat or alter our honey in any way. When the temperature is 10 degrees, we feed our bees organic apples and organic blackberry jam with some sugared water every day. They love this! I also sing to them: usually, and I don't know why, it is "Here Come the Girls!" Furthermore, the common practice of clipping the queen's wings, as many farmers do with their hens, does not happen in our garden! If my queens choose to leave, then they are most welcome to their freedom.

My painting of Sea Bees, featured on this last season's Christmas card, is the beginning of a project that I hope to very

much enjoy. When my extension is built this spring, I will start creating honey pots in my pottery studio, on the theme of the Hightown sea, village and my bees. I hope when the time comes, you will call in and visit.

From Chris's Kitchen

GRANOLA

(Adapted from the Neal's Yard Bakery "Wholefood Cook Book)

To accompany the article on beekeeping in Hightown, my husband, Chris, is offering you a chance to use local honey in a homemade breakfast cereal. Local honey has been shown to have many benefits. It can help to prevent allergies and is a healthier alternative to sugar or sweeteners in drinks. We need the bees to pollinate our flowers, vegetable crops, fruit trees and fruit bushes. The more we use, the more reason for keeping hives and buying from a local producer.

Ingredients

100ml sunflower oil75g sunflower seeds100ml local runny honey25g pumpkin seeds250g jumbo oats150g chopped mixed nuts85g rye flakes30ml wheat germ (optional)115g regular porridge oats150g mixed dried fruit

Dried blueberries and dried cranberries (optional extras)

Method

Heat oven to 140C/Gas Mark 1

Melt oil in a large saucepan. Add all the ingredients, except the dried fruit and the wheatgerm. Mix well and spread on 2 baking trays. Leave in the oven for 1 hour, stirring occasionally to prevent sticking.

Remove from the oven and leave to cool. Add the wheatgerm, if using, and the dried fruit and store in an airtight container.

Serve with milk, yoghurt, soya milk, fruit juice and maybe a topping of chopped fresh fruit.


