Editor's Note

'Change not a clout
Till May is out'



This traditional piece of country wisdom, very old but very apt, reminds us of our fickle British weather and its ability to bathe us in warmth one day and bring chilly winds the next. Sounds familiar? Always keep your coat handy!

It is commonly agreed that the 'May' in this old country proverb does not refer to the month, but to May blossom, more often called hawthorn.

I have long loved this common, overlooked, shape-shifting plant. Most people associate it with hedgerows but it grows into fine trees and can make sturdy bushes. The hawthorn blossom was first brought to my attention when, as a teenager, I read Marcel Proust's 'In Search of Lost Time'. I have never looked at hawthorn blossom in the same way since. Their blossom and scent overwhelm me, as they did the young Marcel, when out on a country walk with his family. They enter a lane of flowering hawthorn and he stops, transfixed.

'A succession of chapels... disappearing beneath the masses of flowers piled up on their altars', their 'dazzling bouquets of stamens...radiating outwards like the fine ribs of Gothic window tracery, the creamy scent filling the air and making the whole lane seem to 'bourdonner'- to buzz, to vibrate. His grandfather then invites him to take a look at the less common pink variety, ' each tiny bud like a pink marble goblet with blood-red depths'.

On your walks during May, why don't you look out for, and enjoy, the remarkable gift of the May blossom.

Dear friends,

We continue in the wonderful season of Eastertide during May. On Thursday 9th, sometimes called Holy Thursday, we celebrate our risen Lord's Ascension into heaven, forty days after Easter, the day of resurrection. We then move into a period of ten days of Ascensiontide, ending with Pentecost, fifty days after Easter. At Pentecost, we remember and give thanks for the descent of the Holy

Spirit on the apostles and other disciples.

God sent his Holy Spirit to empower the Church to perform the mission which the risen Jesus Christ has entrusted to it.

Ascension and Pentecost are closely linked. The risen Lord is no longer present to the Church in the body of his flesh; the Church is now to be the new body of Christ, filled with his life through the gift of the Holy Spirit. We are the body of Christ and filled with the Holy Spirit we are to undertake his service of love and care.

I love this prayer of St Teresa of Avila which sits on my desk in my study:

*Christ has no body now
on earth but yours,
no hands but yours;
no feet but yours.*

*Yours are the eyes through which is to look out
Christ's compassion to the world.*

*Yours are the feet
with which he is
to go about doing good.*

*Yours are the hands
with which he is to bless us now. Amen.*

The Sunday after Pentecost is Trinity Sunday, and whilst in every moment of creation, the whole Trinity is at work redeeming and sanctifying, this day gives us the opportunity to reflect on the revelation of God's self as Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We are blessed and sent out in the name and peace of Christ and in the power of the Holy Spirit to love and to serve the Lord.

This month, let's keep the words of St Teresa close to our hearts and minds.

Aline's Story for Christian Aid Week

In Burundi, a country in East Africa, malnourishment and poverty affect more than 70% of the population, making survival a daily struggle. Jobs and food are hard to come by, and those who have homes often have no electricity or running water.

For Aline, life was a constant struggle. She was married young and gave birth to her eldest son, Fisto, when she was just 14 years old. Aline experienced constant abuse at the hands of her violent husband.

A few years later, Aline faced even more devastation. Her husband married another woman, forcing Aline to flee. He prevented her from taking their children with her, and in a further act of cruelty, told the local community that Aline was mentally ill and unable to care for her children. She wandered the streets, asking anyone for a place to sleep. Hungry, scorned and alone, Aline took her first step towards her new life. She started by participating in a transformative three-day community workshop, funded by Christian Aid.

" I came out with amazing knowledge and skills. The trainer restored a sense of hope and energy in me" says Aline.

She was taught how to form a Village Savings and Loans Association (VSLA) and establish a steady income. VSLAs mean people can save for their future and borrow money to kickstart small rural businesses. With all she had learned, Aline's dream of getting her children back finally felt possible.

With a small start-up loan, Aline started trading avocados and peanuts locally. With her profits, she bought a bicycle so she could transport greater quantities of goods to markets further afield. Eventually, her hard work had finally paid off, and she had earned the money she needed to rent a house.

Once Aline secured a home for herself, her three eldest sons were able to escape their father and join her. They told Aline that their father had abused them and sent their three young siblings to live with different members of his family.

Aline still hopes that she'll be reunited with her youngest children in time.

Today, Aline lives peacefully on her own plot of land in a remote village in the Kayogoro Commune in Makamba Province. She's baked her own bricks and is building a strong home for her and her children in every sense.

Now Aline can afford food, clothes and essential healthcare for her family. She's also purchased solar panels so her children can do their evening homework by electric light.

" I like to feed my family with the produce that I grow, such as beans, vegetables and corn. I am so happy that we are together. Now my children feel supported as they have a parent who can meet their needs" she says.

Shops in Hightown

According to Mrs Gaffney, who provided Miss Scott with much information, The Hightown Stores, (now the doctor's surgery), were established in 1892 by the father of Mr William Gaffney. The small post office and exchange was housed on the premises. In the summer, tents were put up in the garden of the house to accommodate the telegraph boys, so that they were readily available if they were required for the delivery of telegrams. Some years later, alterations were made and part of the house was made into a bread and cake shop.

During WW1 the shop was used as the post office and the telephone exchange was behind the counter with one operator.

The store room for sacks of flour was upstairs on the south side of the house. The sacks were pulled up by pulley and taken through a door. The floor of the room had to be strengthened to bear the weight.

KEDGEREE



So many people are holidaying in India this year, that I thought that a taste of the place would be good to try. This may not be an authentic version but is one which we often have and enjoy. It is frequently found on breakfast menus alongside eggs Benedict and omelette Arnold Bennet to balance the ubiquitous appearance of the “full English”. It makes a good midweek supper dish.

Ingredients

350g smoked haddock fillet, skinned, poached and flaked
3 hard-boiled eggs, chopped into rounds
2 tblsp chopped fresh parsley
40g butter
1 clove
275g long-grain rice
½ tsp salt
large pinch of turmeric
1 cardamom
600ml fish stock

Method

Sweat the butter, turmeric, clove and cardamom together in a flameproof pan. Stir in the rice and cook for 1 minute, then pour in the stock. Add the salt and bring to the boil.

Cover and simmer until the stock is absorbed and the rice tender, about 30 minutes.

Mix in the fish and the eggs and reheat to make sure it is warm throughout. I often add a handful of thawed frozen prawns and a portion of cooked frozen peas to the finished dish. Check the seasoning and serve, garnished with the chopped parsley.
