

# **Finding calm at Christmas**

Are you calm? We live in tense, anxious times, worried about global conflict, climate change, the cost of living the increased tensions and divisions in society. When we retreat into our church communities, we become anxious about numbers, finance, and buildings. As a church, we stress about the theological and doctrinal divisions that we strive to avoid tearing us apart.



It is hard to find calm. In church life, finding calm at Christmas is nearly impossible. It is the season where the work seems to increase: Christmas fairs, carol concerts, extra services all great in themselves yet all increasing the busyness and stress. Then there is the getting ready for the festivities, shopping, cooking, decorating – all things to aid our enjoyment but all adding to the pressure, the stress, the noise.

We need calm. We cannot live our lives at full pace, hurling ourselves from one thing to the other. That's why we have the sabbath, made for humanity by an omnipresent God, A God who does not need to rest but recognised at the moment of creation that the world would need peace. At least for a moment.

Silent Night, Gruber's famous carol first performed on Christmas Eve, has formed the inspiration for the Church of England's Advent and Christmas campaign 2024. It offers a note of calm often in the midst of a rousing carol service or concert. It is, in itself, a simple quiet carol that contrasts with most of the others we sing and provides a moment to quietly reflect on the beautiful moment of God's incarnation. Through the inevitable trauma of labour and childbirth, comes the time when all is still and we can sleep in heavenly peace. While the shepherds are quaking and the choirs of angels are singing, at the centre is the calming presence of Jesus. Jesus, who later would calm the storm, would model times for prayer and solitude in the midst of his busy ministry, and would stand calmly defiant in the face of the persecution that led to his victory on the cross.

We all have storms in our lives and we all need to recognise, for the people and communities we serve, that Christmas is not always a time of joy and celebration, but can be an occasion when the storms in their lives reach a crescendo and they need calm.

This advent, this Christmas, I pray that your church can be for you and for your community a place of calm. That you can bring yourselves and others to stand before the Prince of Peace to find the peace, the calm, that you need this Christmas.

# **People in our Parish**

We extend our congratulations to Commander Cedric Loughran, who was recently presented with his Honorary Fellows Degree by Liverpool John Moores University. Cedric learned all of his early seamanship through the 19th Crosby Sea Scouts.

Following an engineering apprenticeship at Tate and



Lyle and management training at Marks and Spencer, he "ran away to sea" with Sugar Line and then Mobil Shipping, where he sailed some of the largest vessels in the world. He was an Auxiliary Coastguard during his leave periods. He gained his Chief Engineer Unlimited Steam and Motor Certificate, studying at Liverpool Polytechnic, now LJMU.

A maritime shore career followed, leading ultimately to the Department for Transport, Surveyor General's Department – now the MCA, working in numerous mercantile marine offices. Surveying the Anglo Spanish and Anglo Dutch fishing fleets involved much overseas travel. Gaining his MSc at Liverpool JMU, he became the Senior Examiner of Engineers at Liverpool and received promotion to be Head of Fishing Safety for the United Kingdom, the Falkland Islands and South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands –working towards consistent safety and living conditions for fishing vessels under our Flag – and subsequently foreign vessels fishing in Antarctica and the Southern Ocean.

He represented the United Kingdom at the International Maritime Organisation in London, the International Labour Organisation in Geneva and the European Council Committee of Safe Seas in Brussels.

He has been actively involved with LJMU for some decades, as an industrial advisor to the staff and PhD students, facilitating their academic liaison with industry. He is engaged with Learned Body Affairs and is committed to life long learning.

He was awarded the Merchant Navy Medal for services to the MCA and the Fishing Industry Safety Group. He is a Younger Brother of Trinity House. Concurrently, he completed a parallel career in the Royal Navy and Royal Naval Reserve completing staff courses at Britannia Royal Naval College, Greenwich Royal Naval College, The United Kingdom Defence Academy Shrivenham and the NATO Staff College in Rome. He was the Commanding Officer of HMS Eaglet and Officer in Charge of Royal Naval Headquarters, Merseyside, immediately before becoming the United Kingdom Director of Amphibious Warfare and embarking as part of the UK Maritime Battle Staff on Flagship HMS Ark Royal as Ships Taken Up from Trade Officer for Operation Telic. He was in his element: Complex multi-faceted decisions, requiring incisive social and emotional intelligence fascinated him. The interface where technology and humans meet , under extreme prejudice, kept him busy 18 hours a day and he was awarded the Reserve Decoration.

Many service-related appointments have been completed: President of Liverpool Sea Cadets, Naval Liaison Officer to the CCF at Merchant Taylors School, President of the Anglesey Royal Naval Association to name but a few. Currently, he is Vice Chairman Navy for the Reserve Forces and Cadets Association of the North West of England and the Isle of Man, a post he has held for over two decades and is also Chairman of the Altcar Camp Committee. He remains active in numerous maritime charities. He is an Engineer European, a Chartered Engineer, a Chartered Marine Engineer, a Fellow of the Institute of Marine Engineering, Science and Technology and a Fellow of the Society of Consulting Marine Engineers and Ship Surveyors.

He is devoted to his wife and family, who sometimes only see him fleetingly, but are supportive in all he does to try to make the world a better place.

He has a lifelong passion for sailing yachts and dinghies and is never happier than being afloat, especially in salt water.
